Medals and Awards

The army has a proud record of giving medals to those deserving of thanks for deeds done or work carried out. The majority of medals are limited to those carrying out military rolls however there are medals for those who do not hold military rank and are seen as deserving reward from the army.

Medals should never be limited to any specific part of the army such as holders of rank. They are there to reward and as such should not be treated lightly and handed out without due consideration to their worth. To issue medals without due consideration to their value would be to water this value down to the point of becoming worthless to all in the army. For this reason the Lord General will always have the ultimate decision on if and what medal is awarded.

All of these can be awarded to individuals, Regiments or Brigades. Medals or awards should be submitted to the Chief of Staff for agreement by the Lord General. through the chain of command using the form SKF1

Eligibility : Any combatant (Military medal)

Citations include : Command of the Army
Prolonged and exceptional contribution to the Sealed Knot that the Army wishes to recognise

Ceremony : Citation published in Orders
Printed Commendation
Awarded in front of Army

Gold Fairfax

Recommendation : The Lord General

Eligibility : Any combatant (Military medal)

Citations include : Prolonged and exceptional contribution to the Army

Ceremony : Citation published in Orders
Printed Commendation
Awarded in front of Army

Gold Dunbar.

Recommendation : The Lord General

Eligibility : Any combatant (Military & non military medal)

Citations include : Prolonged and exceptional contribution to the Army

Awarded in front of Army

Awarded in front of own Regiment or Brigade.

Commonwealth Medal

Recommendation : Any Officer may recommend via a citation

Eligibility : Anyone.

Citations include : Sustained contribution over a period of time to Regiment
A remarkable contribution to an event
Awarded where recognition is needed at ground level.

Ceremony : Citation published in Orders
Printed Commendation
No presentation ceremony necessary but awarded in front of own Regiment.

Lord Generals Commendation

Recommendation : Informal recommendations may be made to the LG

Eligibility : Anyone.

Citations include : A particular action on the battlefield
A particular contribution to an event
Awarded where recognition is needed but action not worthy of a medal.

Ceremony : Citation published in Orders
Printed Commendation
No presentation ceremony necessary.
